Everything changed after the trip

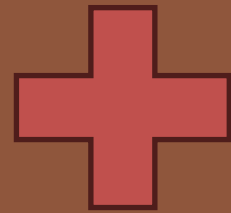
Did you go anywhere last weekend?

We use INDEFINITE PRONOUNS
to talk about people, things or places
that are NOT DEFINITE

some / any / no / every



one / body

thing

Where

To talk about people

To talk about things

To talk about places

In affirmative sentences

In negative and interrogative sentences

In affirmative sentences with negative meaning

In affirmative, negative and interrogative sentences

	ONE / BODY	THING	WHERE
SOME	someone / somebody	something	somewhere
ANY	anyone / anybody	anything	anywhere
NO	no one / nobody	nothing	nowhere
EVERY	everyone / everybody	everything	everywhere

The verb after INDEFINITE PRONOUNS
is always at the third person singular

Ex:

Everyone knows him

Everybody is tired

Nobody is here
